

Q. Do GORge Pass transit providers allow pets on their buses?

A. Service animals are allowed on all buses, but please contact each local transit provider for more information about their guidelines for bringing pets onto the bus.

Q. What health and safety precautions are taken?

A. GORge Pass transit providers may require masks and other safety and health precautions. Check before you go at gorgepass.com

Q. Does the GORge Pass include Dial-A-Ride service?

A. No. While all providers offer Dial-A-Ride services that can pick you up at your home and take you wherever you need to go within the service area, the GORge Pass is only good for fixed routes or set schedules. 

- An annual pass connecting Portland/Vancouver and the Columbia Gorge. The GORge Pass is good for the calendar year, ending on December 31.
- Unlimited fixed route rides on all Columbia Area Transit (including the Columbia Gorge Express and the Gorge-to-Mountain Express), The Link Public Transit, Mt. Adams Transportation Service, and Skamania County Transit buses.

HOW TO BUY

1. Buy a virtual GORge Pass to download to your smartphone at gorgepass.com.
2. Buy a printed GORge Pass at any of the transit provider offices or at any of the locations listed on gorgepass.com.

HOW TO USE

Virtual GORge Pass

Open the **Token Transit** app (visit gorgepass.com to purchase the GORge Pass and download the Token Transit app).

1. Go to My Passes menu and click on GORge Pass.
2. Show the driver your virtual GORge Pass.



Printed Card Pass

Tap your GORge Pass on the bus card reader as you board or show the driver your printed GORge Pass.

OTHER FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Is there a reduced rate for seniors?

A. There is no special rate for seniors as the GORge Pass is already offered at a reduced rate.

Q. Are GORge Pass buses limited-mobility accessible?

A. Yes. All buses have either lifts or ramps for riders using mobility devices, and our drivers are specially trained to assist those with disabilities. Seating on our vehicles is prioritized for people with disabilities and for seniors.

Q. How often does the Columbia Gorge Express (CGE) bus run?

A. The CGE runs from the Gorge to Portland seven days a week stopping in Hood River, Cascade Locks, Multnomah Falls, Troutdale, and Portland with connecting bus service to The Dalles.
